BIOGRAPY OF PAULO CELHO

Paulo Coelho is a Brazilian novelist. He was born on Augustus 24, 1947 in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. He was born into a Catholic family, his parents were strict about the religion and faith. His father is an engineer. He's a logical, reasonable man with a very clear vision of the world. The parents wishes he enrolled in law school and abandoned his dream of becoming a writer. His parents, hoping for the best for the children. But as a teenager, he wanted to become a writer.

One year later, he dropped out and lived life as a hippie. He traveling through South America, North Africa, Mexico, and Europe and started using drugs in the 1960s. Upon his return to Brazil, Coelho worked as a songwriter, composing lyrics for Elis Regina, Rita Lee, and Brazilian icon Raul Seixas. He was not satisfied with his career and tried his hands at a variety of professions before he finally became a writer. In 1974, he was worked as an actor, journalist, and theatre director before pursuing his writing career. In 1982, his was published first book, *Hell Archieves*. However it was not successful. And in 1987, *The Pilgrimage* was published. The very next year, he published *The Alchemist*. The story tell about a shepherd who has a recurring dream of finding treasure in Egypt. It is a successful book and made him famous. He's sold 35

million copies and translated into 81 different languages and winning the Guinness World Record for most translated book by a living author.

Coelho has written and published 30 books and sold more than 210 million books in over 170 countries worldwide. On 22 December 2016, he was listed by UK-based company Richtopia at number 2 in the list of 200 Most Influential Authors in the world. The personal life and legacy, he has been married to the artist Christina Oiticica since 1980. The couple divides their time between Europe and Brazil. In 1996, he founded the Paulo Coelho institute which provides aid to impoverished children and elderly people. He also serves as the UNESCO special counsellor for "Intercultural Dialogues and Spiritual Convertences".
