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## **ABSTRACT**

This research discusses about sexuality disguise experienced by Russell in Brent Hartinger's *Geography Club*. Russel Middlebrook, the main character, is portrayed as a sophomore High School student in the novel. The research aims to describe the heteronormative pressure experienced by Russell throughout his High School era as a gay student. The research utilizes qualitative research due to the fact that it provides understanding into the problem being studied by deriving meanings from the data of the research. Moreover, this research applies extrinsic approach. The extrinsic approach applied is queer criticism. The data source of this research is *Geography Club* novel by Brent Hartinger. The research shows that heteronormative pressure experienced by Russell makes him decide to hide his true sexual identity. He has several reasons why he has to hide his true sexual identity i.e. afraid of being rejected by his parents, close friends, and school friends, heteronormative pressure, and afraid of bullying and harassment. Russel hides his true sexual identity by joining a baseball team and dating a girl.
