

DEMELZA'S PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT IN WINSTON GRAHAM'S *ROSS POLDARK*

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Abstract: The purpose of this study is to analyze personality development and the changing attitudes of one of the important characters, Demelza Poldark, in the story entitled *Ross Poldark* by Winston Graham. The writer formulates problems for this study, the first formulated problem discusses the personality of Demelza. The second formulated the conflicts portrayed inside the story and the third problem discusses how Demelza Poldark's personality development. This thesis is used in the qualitative method. The number one supply is the radical via *Ross Poldark* through Winston Graham. To analyze the problems formulated above, the writer uses the theory of character from I.A. Schirova, the theory of conflict by way of Holman & Harmon, and the theory of personality development by using Elizabeth Hurlock. The study results are; first, Demelza's personality before her marriage traits are, to begin with stubborn, impolite, and incapable of doing the family. second, Demelza's character after her marriage *Ross* for the first time became a mild, polite one and able to do the family chores. She grows up in conflicts portrayed inside the tale between her father and her husband. Demelza's struggle with her father starts off evolved when she makes a mistake with *Ross*. The second struggle is between Demelza and *Ross*. She becomes struggling to overcome all the conflicts and Demelza's personality changes. Demelza finally becomes a gentle, polite, and capable lady. It can be concluded that conflicts and challenges do not usually necessarily exist to carry humans down, as a substitute conflicts and challenges can serve a better reason: to deliver the excellent out of people.

The character also influences what we suppose, our ideals, values, and expectancies. What we think about others relies upon our personality (Allport, 1998).

In personality there's also a term commonly referred to as *personality development*, namely, that refreshes the method by way of which the organized thought and conduct patterns that makeup someone's particular character emerge over the years. Many elements impact character, such as genetics and environment, how we had been parented, and societal variables. Greater importantly, it's far the continued interaction of a majority of these impacts that still shape personality. Personality now not most effective entails inborn trends however also the development of cognitive how we assume and act as a process of developing and enhancing one's persona (Beck et al., 2015)

In other words, personality development enables an individual to advantage self-belief and high self-esteem. Personality development is also stated to have a high-quality effect on one's conversation abilities and the way he/she sees the world. People generally tend to increase a high-quality mindset as a result of personality development. Therefore, personal development is very necessary. it is because in each nook of our lives we are required to develop and expand, even from small things (Roberts & Jackson, 2008).

Personality development has been a major topic of interest for some of the most outstanding thinkers in psychology. Since the inception of psychology as a

separate science, researchers have proposed a selection of thoughts to provide an explanation for how and why personality develops. This thesis discusses the personality development of Demelza's personality in Winston Graham's novel, *Ross Poldark*. Set in Cornwall, England, in 1783, Ross Poldark's story arises interest. The tale begins after Ross returns from the Yankee modern struggle. Upon getting into Charles' house, the family was amazed by Ross's presence because anyone concept Ross had died on the battlefield, seeing all of his own family accumulated. A new chapter in Ross's life began when he meet an innocent girl from Illuggan, Demelza. Demelza changed into a girl who has constantly beaten and tortured by using her father and her six brothers. Sooner or later she ran away and turned nearly crushed by a marketplace traveler, Ross controlled to keep her and hires Demelza. Ross' story with Demelza persevered, Unknowingly, Demelza had changed her conduct until she ought to eventually do all the paintings in Ross's

house and she or he have become an outstanding lady from Nampara. the two had emotions for every different. But, numerous issues came and went into Demelza's existence.

The author of this novel changed into Winston Graham, born Winston Graham (30 June 1908 – 10 July 2003), an English novelist great known for the Poldark series of historic novels set in Cornwall. In his literary career, Graham's 2nd novel *The house with the Stained Glass windows* became posted in 1934. His second Poldark novel, *Demelza Poldark*, become posted in 1945 and become succeeded through 11 similar titles, the ultimate of which, *Bella Poldark*, changed into published in 2002.

This study uses fourth theory. First, the theory of character by Schirova entitled *How to Analyze Fiction*. Schirova said that “character were short prose sketches of different types of people moulded to a pattern” (Schirova, 2006:23-24). In book *How to Analyze Fiction*, Schirova stated that there are two varieties of characterization. There are flat character and dynamic character. Flat character have one or two qualities are ideas or personality, it may be abstract idealization or it may be caricature which ridicules a person by exaggerating and distorting his most prominent features. Dynamic character, especially main character, and typically grow in understanding. The climax of this growth is epiphany, that means to describe a sudden revolution of truth experienced by a character. Second, theory of personality development by Elizabeth Hurlock. According to Hurlock, “personality is the dynamic organization within the individual of those psychological system which determines his behavior and thought” (Hurlock, 1976:7). The writer can say that personality is something which differentiates a human being to the

other human being. Every person in this exactly has their own personality which is going to work as a personal or individual identity for human. Third, theory of conflict, the theory of conflict is used by the writer in order to explain how the conflict lead the main character's personality development. Literary work is the reflection of our life, it means that literary work also has the same element which we face in our reality. This study takes one of those elements as the material, which it is conflict. Holman and Harmon say that “conflicts are the struggle that grows out the two opposing forces in a plot” (Harmon & Holman, 2003:107). The last theory, is theory of the relation between literature and psychology. According to Wellek and Warren in *Theory of Literature*, character in play or novel are judged by the readers to be psychologically true. Sometimes psychological theory, held either consciously or dimly by an author, seems to be fit a figure or a situation (Wellek & Warren, 1956).

Research Method

In this thesis, the writer uses qualitative research which is an inquiry method of knowledge based totally on awesome methodological traditions of inquiry that discover a social or human hassle. The writer takes the data from the novel that is written by Winston Graham entitled *Ross Poldark*, and numerous references along with internet and a few books associated with the novel. The writer collects the data by reading the novel. Then the writer develops an outline and interpretations of the problem of the thesis.

Result and Discussion

This section is divided into three parts. The first part concerns on how the personality development of Demelza as the second character in the novel *Ross Poldark* described. The second part talks

about the conflict which undergoes in the story. The third part is analyzing Demelza's personality development and how the conflicts affect her personality.

The Description of The Character

According to Schirova there are two types of the character. Round which usually main character and takes big part in a story and flat which is normally found as minor character. Round character is dynamic that means it is changing or developing (Schirova, 2006). The story *Ross Poldark* in book II and Book III shows us almost all about Demelza, she appears from the beginning of the story until the end of the story. It means that Demelza is the main character of the story.

Demelza's Personalities before Her Marriage

Stubborn

Before her marriage, Demelza is shown as a stubborn young girl. It seems like she does not want to go back to her house. She runs away from her house at the age of eleven. She does not say anything to her father and just leaves.

The conflict between Ross also makes Demelza hate her father and keep that feeling by herself without telling it to Ross. This is also supported by Demelza's decision to enter Nampara. It is not for a good reason but merely to stay in distance from her family and cut all kinds of communication with her father and the people she knows, living by herself.

Demelza. "I don't want to go home ever," she said.

Ross. "It will be necessary to see your father and get his consent. That may be hard to come by."

Demelza. "I'm a good scrubber," she said. "I can scrub...sur."

Ross. "We will go and see your father now. If he can be--"

Demelza. "Not now. Take me with you. I can scrub. I'm a good scrubber."

(Graham, 2015:94)

From the dialogue it can be seen that Demelza does not want to come back home anymore. Demelza cuts all of the topic about her father. It shows that Demelza stubbornly opposes Ross's opinion of going back home.

Tom carne "Now look ee here, Demelza, I've walked all this way to see ee, an' I've come to aks ee to come home. I've come to see Cap'n Poldark to explain why."

Demelza. "Cap'n Poldarks in to truro. But I've told ee afore. I want to stay here."

Tom Carne "Well-a-fine. 'Tis she in part do feel you be betterer wi' we than 'ere in this house exposed to all the temptations o' the world, the flesh, and the devil. You're but sixteen yet"

Demelza. "Seventeen."

Tom Carne. "No matter. You're too young to be wi'out guidance." "Do ee ever go to church or meetin' house?"

Demelza. "Not so often."

(Graham, 2015:235)

Some other proofs above also show that Demelza character is stubborn. Demelza does not want to go back home even though her father Tom Carne has come all the way from Illugan to Nampara to pick her up back home.

Impolite

Demelza is an impolite person. She always wears dirty and dingy clothes like a tramp. As long as she lives she always dresses dirty because at home she feeds pigs and does work that makes all her clothes dirty and looks like a man. She thinks that there is nothing else to do at that point and takes things for granted. The part of the story which shows that

Demelza is a girl who always looks like a boy and is very dirty before she met Ross.

Ross. "Now," he said, "if you are to work for me, you must first be clean. D'you understand that?"

Demelza. "Yes... sur."

Ross. "I cannot allow anyone dirty into the house. No one works for me if they are not clean and don't wash. So take off your clothing and stand under the pump. I will work the pump for you."

Demelza. "Yes... sur."

"And don't put those things on again," he said. "I'll find you something clean."

Demelza. "P'r'aps," she said, "I could work the 'andle meself."

(Graham, 2015:97-98)

It shows that Demelza does not look very good. The other evidence shows that Demelza is an impolite person is shown in the part of the story when Prudie finds herself enlisted in a campaign in which she has no personal belief: the war on lice. It is necessary to point out to Demelza at frequent intervals that her new master wouldn't tolerate dirty bodies or dirty hair.

Prudie. "Wash, wash, wash," Jud. "Like a blathering duck," said Jud, who had just entered the kitchen."

Prudie. "An't washed enough," said Jud sarcastically. "Tedn't right fur human beings to 'ave skins.

"No," she said, "but you an't gotten any hair."

(Graham, 2015:126)

Demelza ignores the rules that Ross has told her when she first meets him. She does not care if she is dirty or not. She does not care about the advice of other servant who saw her working in filthy clothes that are so dusty and with her filthy hands She believes that

personality is not everything for her. It only changes people to somebody else.

Incapable of Doing the Household Chores

Demelza is incapable of doing the household, she only does the work when there's an order from her father. Her father just wants her to follow orders from him, to be discipline and orderly. Demelza's dialogue with Ross shows this.

Ross. "What work do you do?"

Demelza. "Looking after the 'ouse and plantin' taties an' feeding the pig."

Ross. "How many brothers and sisters have you?"

Demelza. "Six brothers."

Ross. "All younger than you?"

Demelza. "Es-s." She turned her head and whistled piercingly to Garrick.

(Graham, 2015:93)

Demelza is a person who not only argue her father, but she is also very rude when talking to her father. It can be seen when Demelza only eats leftover food from her father or siblings. This dialogue bellow shows that her father's harsh words makes Demelza become a girl who has no manners when talking to older people.

Tom Carne "When you left me, I was in the darkness and the shadow o' death. I was the servant o' the devil. Last year I was convinced o' sin under Mr. Dimmick. Now I am a noo man altogether."

"Oh," said Demelza.

Tom Carne, "hath brought me out of a horrible pit of mire an' clay, and set my feet 'pon a rock. There's no more drinkings and living in sin, Dattur. We d' live a good life an' we'd be willing to

welcome ee back. Tis your natural place in the world.”

Demelza, “It's mortal kind of you, Fathur. I'm that glad there's been a change. It would seem like leaving home to come back wi' you. I learned all 'bout farming here and everything. I'm part of the house.”(Graham, 2015:235)

From the previous data findings in Demelza' before show that the judge demelza is the dynamic character, because it shows in Demelza's personality after her marriage are she is grows in understanding.

Demelza's Personalities afer Her Marriage

Demelza personality changes a lot after she marries Ross Poldark. There are a lot of family conflicts between her father and Poldark family especially when she sleeps with Ross. Demelza meets new people in her journey. Ross's cousin and the other servant finally give Demelza a new point of view and slowly change her personality. Her new personalities appear when she is wandering to Nampara.

Gentle One

Demelza turns into a gentle lady. In the story she is able to interact and gain a lot of friends during her journey and almost every person that she meets likes her. She realizes that the existence of other people in her life is important. Demelza gets so excited when she meets new people, she is able to quickly adjust her position when she meets new people. This can be seen in some parts in the story that show her gentleness. One of them is when she comes into Trenwith Houses.

Aunt Agatha “What?” she said. “Carkeek? Cardew? Carne? Carne, did you say? Where does she come from? Where do you come from, child?”

“Illuggan,” said Demelza.

“Where? Oh, that's near the Bassetts' place, is it not? You'll know Sir Francis. Intelligent young fellow, they say, but overconcerned with social problems.” Aunt Agatha stroked the whiskers on her chin. “Come here, bud. I don't bite. How old are you?”

(Graham, 2015:322)

Another scene that shows her gentle character not only to humans, but also to animals is when Demelza welcomes Garrick their family's dog, when she returns home after being gone for a month.

Something scratched at the window. She listened with her heart thumping. Then suddenly she caught something familiar in the noise, and she jumped from the bed and flew to the window. Then when a six-inch gap had been slowly levered at the bottom, a wriggling black thing squirmed into the room, and she had her arms round Garrick's neck, half strangling him from love and anxiety that he should not bark.

(Graham, 2015:101)

Due to her good personality, Demelza can make almost every person she meets in her journey feel like Demelza is a part of their family or even their life. The quotation above shows how Demelza hopes that Jim would come back to help her when she is in a danger, even though she knows Jim is just a young man working in her husband's mine.

Why had Jim left his comfortable bed and gone out into the wild night just in the hope of picking up some bit of wreckage? She had asked him not to go, but he had taken no notice. That was the way: always she asked him not to go, and always he made an excuse and

went. Two or three nights every week he would be absent—to return in the small hours with a pheasant or a plump partridge under his arm.
(Graham, 2015:193)

Polite

After so many experiences and conflicts, Demelza turns into a polite lady. She begins to open herself to the new things. She begins to speak up politely but clearly, considering Demelza is so rigid as is shown in the early part of the story.

“Where's Cap'n Poldark?” Tom Carne said, “I come to see him. I got to explain and then 'e'll understand. There'll be no call for wrastling this time.”

“He's from home,” she said bluntly.

Demelza, “You can't do nothing 'bout un. You got to come.”

“You can't expect me to say 'yes,' just like that and come away, after all these years. I got to see Cap'n Ross. He engaged me by the year. I'll see what he says and leave you know.” (Graham, 2015:236)

The dialogue above shows Demelza's willingness to talk about her feeling about things. Demelza starts to think the existence of agreement in her life is important, she starts to think that she could not just sit back and agree with other people's opinions. She also wants to prove who she is to everyone now. She already has a high position in the eyes of society now. The dialogue above shows that she wants to talk about her feeling of being a new mother. It is shown in how she always talks about who she is when her husband asks her to come home on Christmas event.

Demelza, “But it would be something awful, Ross. Here I am Mistress Poldark. I can wind up the clock when I like.”

Ross, “They are so much better than you, you think?”

Demelza, “No, I did not say so.”

“You think I ought to be ashamed of you?, Oh, Ross, they are your own kind,” she said. “I am not.”

(Graham, 2015:319)

This is another proof that Demelza has turned into a polite lady, it is really different from her previous personality. She can quickly understand how to speak well and clearly when she wants to explain something.

A talkative girl at meals, full of questions and speculations, she took little part in the conversation at this meal, refused the burnt claret which the others drank and herself drank only the home-brewed ale. But she didn't look bored and her manner was always one of intelligent interest while Elizabeth spoke of people she did not know or gave some anecdote of Geoffrey Charles. When she was drawn in, she answered pleasantly and naturally and without affectation.

(Graham, 2015:336)

Capable of Doing the Household Chores

In the story, it is also shown that Demelza is now a capable lady. Demelza has easily changed her bad habit by doing a better thing by her own way and path to achieve her goal. Demelza becomes a person that can do all household chores. She refuses to follow the rule or instruction that she finds in her life.

The first evidence of this is when Ross offers a sweet dinner to Demelza at night, then she quickly prepares the necessity such as food. She does not want to bother her maids while they are sleeping at night. She deliberately starts

the work herself on the basis of the responsibility of being a wife.

Ross, "And the moon's up. What if we rowed round to Sawle and watched them putting down the tuck net."

Demelza, "Ross, that would be lovely!, no, no, let us go, just the two of us! Let us go alone. You and I, Ross." She was almost dancing before his chair. "I will row. I am as strong as Jud any day. He laughed. "You'd think it was a ball I'd invited you to. D'you think I can't row you that far myself?"

(Graham, 2015:276)

Another dialogue that shows she is capable is when the last summer in the living room there are no decorations at all, it's quiet like an uninhabited house, Demelza still keeps looking for another decorations, cleaning the whole house to make it look fresh again.

During all the months of that summer the house of Nampara was seldom without flowers. This was Demelza's doing. She was always up at dawn and, now that the dread of being kidnapped and taken home for a thrashing had left her, she wandered at will in the fields and lanes, the lolloping Garrick trailing at her heels, to return with a big bunch of wildflowers, which found their way into the parlour.

(Graham, 2015:154)

Another proof that she can do anything is she becomes a fast learner. That is shown at Christmas time at Trenwith, when she is asked to present a show and then she does poetry. Even Ross does not know Demelza is good at poetry at that time. Demelza gets a lot of plaudits from leaving Poldark.

"Not skilled," said Ross, squeezing Demelza's arm, "but a very quick learner."

"Oh yes," agreed Demelza.

From the dialogue above, Demelza is someone who is talented but she doesn't want to show it in just any place and opportunity. Demelza has become a dignified woman.

Demelza's conflicts portrayed in The Story

According to Harmon & Holman, (2003:110), conflicts have different situations or conditions which is a struggle against person. In other words, the characters struggle when they deal with another person. The conflicts that are analyzed start from the conflicts that happens in Demelza current life. The following part explains the most important conflicts that give impact to Demelza's personality development.

The conflict between Demelza and Her Father

This subchapter is mainly about the journey of the character, Demelza Poldark. As the story is in third person point of view and it is narrated by Demelza's Father named Tom Carne, there are a lot of scenes that shows what happen between them. This conflict can be analyzed using Harmon & Holman's theory as well. Harmon explains that there are four categories of a family. This type of conflicts is similar to the stem conflict explained by Harmon, where a conflict has a struggle against **society**. In the middle of the story, Demelza gets a

warning from her father about the sin that Demelza did.

Tom Carne, "Is there any sin twixt you and Poldark?"

Demelza, "Sin?"

Tom Carne "Don't look so innocent."

Demelza, "There's nought twixt us except what should be between master and servant. But you did ought to know I'm hired by the year."

Tom Carne, "There's talk about you, talk that comes so far as Illuggan. Whether us all lies or no"

Demelza, "It's nothing to do wi' me what folks say."

(Graham, 2015:237)

Conflict between Demelza and her Husband

Another dialogue that proofs is the conflict between Demelza and Her Husband. It occurs when the character faces outside force which are not the same of the character's desire, belief or thinking. All of the differences create a conflict the character and the people around her.

Demelza and her husband are often involved in a conflict. It is because Demelza did things that went against her position with Ross, as master and servant. The part when she will be engages to Ross Poldark.

Ross, "Maybe. Now go you off and forget this ever happened."

Demelza, "My legs are wet." She pulled up the front of the pink petticoat and began to wipe her knee.

Ross, "You know what people say of you, Demelza?"

Demelza "What?"

Ross, "If you act like this, what they say of you will become true."

Demelza, "I live only for you, Ross."

In this subchapter, the personality development of Demelza Poldark will be described using the theory from Hurlock's *Personality Development*. The theory from Hurlock explains that there are two aspects that in human life, which are individual aspect and social aspect. Both of them have different concern. Based on the characters of Demelza in the previous subchapter, it is found that Demelza's characters change through the conflict that she faces. The discussion below is the analysis of the conflict that lead to Demelza's personality development.

From a Stubborn Woman Into a Gentle One

Demelza is a stubborn person when she still stayed to be Ross's servant. As the writer explained earlier. Demelza doesn't want to go back home at all. The scene when she is on the way back home and meets Ross in the middle of the road, watches her with pitifully, walking alone with a dog Garrick, then Ross offers a job to be a kitchen maid.

From an Impolite Woman to a Polite One

In the early part of the story, Demelza is known as an impolite woman. Her father never teaches her about manner because her father busy in his job. She feels empty inside and that makes her easy to get angry. Her attitude is really affected by the conflict she experiences. This is shown in the end of the story when she just starts the performance, she participates with her poetry skills.

better way. She begin to be better manner person that she needs someone else. She learns from stranger how to talk or walk, even in some cases she is not okay. Demelza realized that she cannot live and do everything alone. She starts to work for her little family and accept the manner is important for her to live

Demelza is an incapable. She always tries to do what her father tell her to do. It is shown the story that Demelza is struggle to make her life better. When she uses proves the result a good habit of her live to her husband that she does well in her life.

As they said good night to their relatives two hours later and mounted the broad portrait-hung stairs, Ross was conscious of this new side of her nature which his wife had shown. All through the evening surprise had mingled with his inner amusement: Demelza's charm, almost beauty, in her new and fashionable dress; the impression she had created; her quiet unassuming dignity over the dinner, when he had expected her to be nervous and stiff or boisterous and hungry.

The narration above is the fact that proves to her husband that she has succeeded in being a smart wife who is able to do any housework. Finally, she proves to everyone that she is capable of growing to be better than before and it seems her husband completely agree with her decision by offering her a financial help.

Conclusion

The problems which might be discussed inside the preceding bankruptcy are concluded. Demelza Poldark is

described as a stubborn lady inside the starting of story. She constantly acts in keeping with her desires. She is likewise an impolite woman who thinks that no one care about her.
