APPENDIX I SYNOPSIS OF HARRY POTTER AND THE SOCERER'S STONE.

Ten-year-old Harry Potter is an orphan who lives in the fictional London suburb of Little Whinging, Surrey, with the Dursleys: his uncaring Aunt Petunia, loathsome Uncle Vernon, and spoiled cousin Dudley. The Dursleys barely tolerate Harry, and Dudley bullies him. One day Harry is astonished to receive a letter addressed to him in the cupboard under the stairs (where he sleeps). Before he can open the letter, however, Uncle Vernon takes it. Letters for Harry subsequently arrive each day, in increasing numbers, but Uncle Vernon tears them all up, and finally, in an attempt to escape the missives, the Dursleys go to a miserable shack on a small island. On Harry's 11th birthday, a giant named Hagrid arrives and reveals that Harry is a wizard and that he has been accepted at the Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry. He also sheds light on Harry's past, informing the boy that his parents, a wizard and a witch, were killed by the evil wizard Voldemort and that Harry acquired the lightning-bolt scar on his forehead during the fatal confrontation. At Hogwarts, Harry begins to practice magic and also discovers more and more about his past moments and his parents. Harry is included in the Gryffindor team in the goods pitted Quidditch (race using a broomstick) and becomes a Seeker. He also learns that his father is a Seeker.

One night, Harry, Ron, and Hermione find a giant Three-Headed Dog in a forbidden corridor on the third floor of the school. They managed to escape from the giant Troll and after Harry was nearly knocked off his broom due to someone's powerful magic during one of the Quidditch matches, they assumed that someone was trying to cross the dog. Harry found a mirror Tarsah that can show the desire of a person's heart.

Principal Albus Dumbledore moved the mirror and advised Harry not to look for it again. Using information from Hagrid who uttered it accidentally, Hermione discovered that the dog was guarding the Philosopher's Stone, a stone that could be used to give endless life to its owner.

Harry concludes that his Potion Master, Severus Snape, tried to obtain the stone. Harry was caught when he came out of the dorm at night and he was detained. While helping Hagrid in the dark forest, he sees a hooded figure drinking the unicorn's blood to healing. Harry concludes that the hooded figure is Voldemort and he also concludes that Snape is trying to get the philosopher's stone to return Voldemort in full force.

After hearing from Hagrid that dogs would fall asleep if they were shown music and when he was released talking about it to a man at a local bar one night, Harry, Ron, and Hermione came to the conclusion that Snape was the man at the bar and tried to warn Dumbledore. Upon learning Snape was away on business they concluded that he would try to steal the stone that night and decided to find the stone before Snape found it more and more.

They face a series of obstacles such as: surviving a deadly plant, flying to find the flying kuci fiercely, and winning a chess match that has chess pieces the size of a human. The Trio used their skills to overcome various obstacles. Hermione uses her knowledge of spells to cross the plant, Harry uses her skills as a Seeker to obtain the Flying key, and Ron uses her skills to apply chess players to win chess matches. However, Ron is almost killed in the match and Hermione and Ron stay at the match site while Harry walks to the next room.

In the final room, Harry discovers that it was not Snape who wanted the stone, but the defense against black knowledge teacher, Professor Quirrell. Quirrell reveals that he freed the troll and tried to kill Harry in a Quidditch match. He also reveals that it was Snapelah who had protected Harry and tried to wipe out Quirrell all year. Due to something Dumbledore had done, Harry found the stone in his pocket after seeing himself near Tarsah's Mirror.

As Quirrell tries to catch Harry to get an answer from Harry about what he was keeping in the mirror, Quirrell opens his turban and it appears that Voldemort is living in the reverse aspect of his head. Harry tries to escape but Quirrell unleashes a fire by snapping his fingers to trap him. Voldemort tries to convince Harry to give him the stone by promising to bring his parents back from the dead, but Harry refuses.

Quirrell tries to kill him but Harry's touch prevents Quirrell from hurting Harry and causes his hand to turn to ashes. The final Quirrell tries to retrieve the stone but Harry holds his face, so Quirrell turns to ashes and dies. As Harry tries to stand up, Voldemort's spirit crosses Harry and knocks him unconscious before disappearing.

Harry finds himself in the school hospital with Professor Dumbledore by his side. Dumbledore explains that the stone has been destroyed, and also tells him that Hermione and Ron are fine. Quirrell burns when he touches Harry because, when Harry's mother dies while saving him, his death gives Harry a power, is the power of love to protect Harry from Voldemort. The feast of the denouement of the year,

Dumbledore awarded last-minute boarding points to Harry, Ron, Hermione, and Neville for their bravery and intelligence, so Gryffindor won the boarding Cup. Before Harry and all the students leave Hogwarts for the summer break, Harry realizes that when every other student comes home, Hogwarts is his real home.
