The writing style that combines emotional narrative with social criticism makes *Prejudiced* one of the most popular fanfictions on Wattpad. APPENDIX II

BIOGRAPHY JANE AUSTEN

Jane Austen was born in Steventon, Hampshire, England on 16 December 1775 and died on 18 July 1817. She is recognised as one of the most influential novelists in the history of English literature. Jane Austen began writing from a young age and developed a distinctive writing style, characterised by the use of irony, social criticism, and strong female characters. She lived during the reign of King George III (Georgian era) and wrote extensively about the daily life of the upper middle class in the English countryside. Her works were first published anonymously, and her name only became widely known after her death. Some of her most famous works include *Sense and Sensibility* (1811), *Pride and Prejudice* (1813), *Emma* (1815), *Persuasion* and *Northanger Abbey* (both 1817). The novel *Pride and Prejudice* is the most popular classic and has been adapted in many forms, such as films, plays, and modern fanfiction. Through her works, Jane Austen provided a critical view of the social structure, gender roles, and marriage issues of her time. To this day, her legacy lives on and is the object of literary study around the world.

APPENDIX III

SYNOPSIS OF *PREJUDICED*

Prejudiced tells the story of Ezra Bennet, a sensitive and critical young man who lives with his mother and two younger brothers, Madison and Pandora, in a matriarchal world where women have complete power and men occupy a lower social position. After the death of his father, Ezra feels responsible for looking after his family and often feels alienated from the surrounding society. The story begins when the family receives an invitation to a ball from Miss Bingley, a wealthy woman who has recently moved to the town. At the party, Ezra meets two high society women, Miss Jane Bingley and Miss Anne Darcy. Pandora immediately falls in love with Jane, while Ezra is attracted to the cold and reserved Miss Darcy. However, Ezra and Miss Darcy's relationship did not go smoothly due to their mutual misunderstandings, class differences, and stubbornness. In the midst of this complicated relationship, Ezra must also deal with social pressure, family demands, and inner conflicts about who he is and the future he wants. APPENDIX IV

SYNOPSIS OF *PRIDE AND PREJUDICED*

Pride and Prejudice tells the story of Elizabeth Bennet, the second of five sisters in the Bennet family, who lives in rural England with her parents. When a wealthy Bingley family moves into their neighbourhood, Jane Bennet - Elizabeth's sister - attracts the attention of Mr Bingley, while Elizabeth herself clashes with Bingley's best friend, Mr Darcy, who seems arrogant and unfriendly. Elizabeth sees Darcy as a haughty man, while Darcy thinks Elizabeth is too quick to judge and comes from an unworthy family. The tension between the two comes to a head after Elizabeth learns that Darcy has broken up the relationship between Jane and Bingley. However, after Darcy proposes to Elizabeth out of the blue and is flatly rejected, their relationship begins to change slowly as Elizabeth learns about the other side of Darcy that she did not realise before, including Darcy's silent help in saving her family's reputation from scandal. On the other hand, Elizabeth's younger siblings experience events that expose the differences in character between them, while her mother is busy trying to find matches for her daughters. Over time, Elizabeth and Darcy begin to understand each other, improve their attitudes, and eventually fall in love without prejudice. The story ends with the marriages between Elizabeth and Darcy and Jane and Bingley, marking the union of two families previously separated by social class and misunderstanding.
