

CHAPTER I

INTRODUCTION

This chapter deals with the background of the study, problems of the study, objectives of the study, the significance of the study, scope and limitation of the study, and research method.

1.1 Background of the Study

One of life problem is a conflict. Conflict is a dramatic event referred to the struggle of two balance's strength and created strong response (Wellek & Warren, 1989: 285)

Conflict is present everywhere in the world around all the human beings. They experience conflict in their life, and it can be minor or major. A conflict is a part of life and people can't avoid it.

A conflict in literature is defined as any struggle between opposing forces. Usually, the main character struggles against some other force. This type of conflict is what drives each and every story. During the course of the school year, Charlie has his first date and his first kiss, he deals with bullies, he experiments with drugs and drinking, and he makes friends, loses them, and gains them back. He creates his own soundtrack through a series of mix tapes full of iconic songs, reads a huge stack of classic books, and gets involved in the *Rocky Horror Picture Show*.

Charlie has a relatively stable home life, with a supportive parents that always shower him love. Unfortunately, a disturbing family secret that Charlie has repressed for his entire life surfaces at the end of the school year. Charlie has a severe mental breakdown and ends up hospitalized.

This novel is dominantly expressing conflicts experienced by the main character and inspires the writer to analyze Charlie's internal and external conflicts in Stephen Chbosky's *The Perks of Being a Wallflower*.

1.2 Problem of the Study
