## CHAPTER V

## CONCLUSION

This chapter is a conclusion of what has been discussed in chapter IV. The conclusion is divided into 2 parts. First, based on the stop sounds, the sequence of duration that have the longest duration is the sound $[\mathrm{d}],[\mathrm{g}],[\mathrm{t}],[\mathrm{p}]$, $[\mathrm{b}]$, and $[\mathrm{k}]$. Second, based on the data, each data has different duration on each sounds, data 1 (N.A) has median duration in sounds $[\mathrm{g}],[\mathrm{p}]$, and $[\mathrm{k}]$, data 2 (A.G) has the longest duration in sounds [g], and [t], data 3 (A.N) has median duration in sound [d], data 4 (M.B) has the longest duration in sound [b], the median duration in sound [d] and the shortest duration in sounds $[\mathrm{g}],[\mathrm{k}]$, and $[\mathrm{b}]$, data 5 (D.A) has the longest duration in sounds $[\mathrm{d}],[\mathrm{p}]$, and $[\mathrm{k}]$, the median duration in sounds $[\mathrm{b}]$ and $[\mathrm{k}]$.
