CHAPTER I INTRODUCTION

1.1 Background of The Study

The Help is the novel by American author Kathryn Stockett. The story is about African American women maids and their white women employers in Jackson, Mississippi in the early 1960s. They have been worked for their white employers to raise and nanny their white children, but most of the African American maids were not trusted by the white employers and often became a victim of racial segregation and discriminatory in Jackson, Mississippi, South America. Racial segregation and discriminatory of the African Americans in America exists in many aspects of life, including the public facilities and services, such as in bathroom, the public transportation, hospital, school, and library.

Segregation is the process of isolation of a race, class, color or ethnic group by enforced or voluntary residence in a restricted area, by barriers to social intercourse, by separating academic facilities, or by other discriminatory means. Racial segregation and discriminatory problems had existed in the world that caused by many conflicts and destroyed the reconciliation of mankind. This phenomenon of the lingering social issues that persisted throughout American history is racial segregation and discriminatory.

The effects of segregation in America including the education rights; the health care and services; crimes; and poverty; single-parenthood; public goods inequalities; economically costs. These effects forced the white Americans and the African-Americans to live separately. There was a civil rights movement led by the Congress during the 1964 and these laws made it illegal to separate American citizen based on race, skin color, or national origin in almost all areas of public life in America. The U.S. nation discriminated against immigrants and other minority groups from the other side of the world. The government announced within the 1924 that they had enacted quotas that benefited immigrants from Europe.

From several works, the writer chooses the novel of Kathryn Stockett's *The Help*. The novel tells an illustrative tale of what it was like to live and work as an African American maid during the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960s in racially conflicted Jackson, Mississippi, South America, and how is the white family's perspective towards African American during the early 1960s. This novel was published in 2009 and became a bes

tseller. In 2011, the book also became a successful and popular movie. Kathryn Stockett portrayed the life experience of black maids who worked at the white homes and also the social condition of Jackson, Mississippi, South America in the novel.
