ABSTRACT

This thesis is a report of a study of verbs and verb phrases that are related to the concept of *survival*. The focus of the study is identification of the verbs and verb phrases that are related to the concept of *survival* and the types of semantic relations they hold with *survival*. The theoretical framework is the concept of semantic field based on Kreidler's (1998) and Kennedy's (2003) classification that identifies the types of semantic relation into four: hyponymy, synonymy, antonymy, and collocation. The data are taken from Suzanne Collin's *The Hunger Games*. In analyzing this topic, the thesis writer applies a descriptive qualitative approach because the purpose of the study is to examine and explain the lexical relationsbetween the concept of *survival* and the verbs and verb phrases related to *survival* found in Suzanne Collins's *The Hunger Games*. The study found 77 data which consist of 34 hyponym, 13 synonym, 21 antonym, and 14 collocation. The finding shows that the main theme of the novel is *survival* which expressed in various verbs and verb phrases and these expressions show four different types of meaning relations with the keyword *survival*.
